Green Roofs, Memorials and Heritage Landscapes:

A recent branch sponsored presentation heard Ed Snodgrass, a North American Green Roof specialist and nurseryman, discussing the economic benefits and design technicalities of green roofs. Planted roofs as biological devices can reduce infrastructure and energy costs by improving stormwater management and by controlling ambient air temperature. Planted roofs can come in a range of depths starting from around 12cm and support a variety of plant species including, grasses, shrubs and trees. Internationally, they have been used to improve bird and insect habitat and even to control the temperature of refrigeration warehouses and water treatment plants. Locally, the Christchurch Botanic Gardens has two demonstration green roofs designed by Lincoln University Landscape Students which are trialling the use of native plant species.

Following the August AGM, a new Can/West committee has been voted in and over the coming issues of the newsletter we hope to profile the team and introduce each of the committee members.

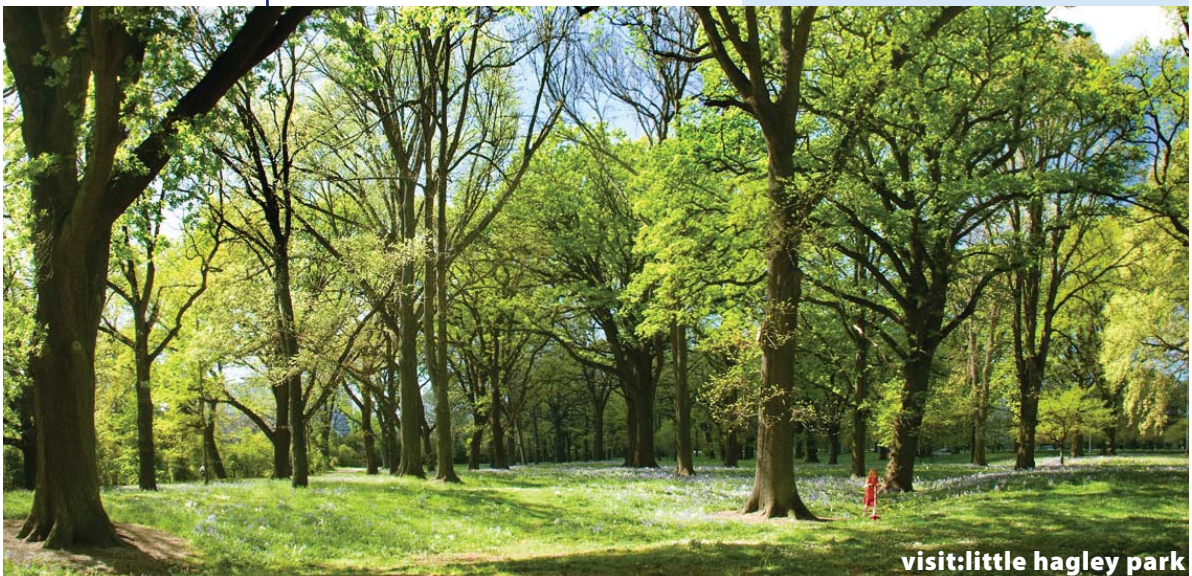

Marc Treib, Professor Emeritus of Architecture at UC Berkeley, recently held a number of seminars and a workshop at Lincoln University. The workshop he held with students involved a discussion about the direction of Landscape Architecture. A key issue raised was the need for better interdisciplinary interaction between the professions and it was suggested that to remedy this, a greater interdisciplinary focus is needed in the foundation year of all associated design degrees. Treib also held a lecture on the UNESCO world heritage site, Skogskyrkogarden, the Woodland Cemetery in Stockholm designed by Gunnar Asplund and Sigurd Leuerentz which was very well received by members.

While different from the woodland cemetery, our own local historic cemeteries including Barbadoes St, Addington (Selwyn St), Linwood (Butterfield Ave) and Woolston (Rutherford St) contain a wealth of cultural and social history and are open from 8.00am-8.30pm
