

Transcript: Frank Boffa describes the efforts made in the early years to publicise the profession.

“Once we had been incorporated we then had to really get the message out and get known and we made numerous submissions on Bills and we’d go to conferences. And, of course, the environmental movement was gathering momentum while we were new on the block. People would seek inputs at conferences and things or you could put forward a paper. And so, you know, things were... Again, the timing was good. And so we rode that wave. But we did a lot of hard work. I mean, I can remember going to Parliament on many occasions and appearing before Select Committees and giving evidence on reviews of this Bill or that Bill or whatever, and we would write. I mean, you know, we – and when I say ‘we’ I mean all of us - we all did a lot, a lot of hard work. But we enjoyed it. It was really, we were riding the crest of a wave and the public feeling was not far behind us...in design, and in ecology, and, you know, the ‘big picture’.”

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
