	Landscape embodies the relationship between people and place. It is the character of an area, how the area is experienced and perceived, and the meanings associated with it.
racter	Each landscape's distinctive combination of physical, associative, and perceptual attributes.
butes	Characteristics and qualities (tangible and intangible) that contribute collectively to landscape character.
es	The reasons a landscape is valued. Values are embodied in certain attributes.
ct	An adverse or positive outcome for a landscape value as a consequence of changes to a landscape's physical attributes.
racter area	A specific area with a common landscape character.
racter type	A kind or class of landscape sharing certain generic characteristics.
	Those elements that are of natural origin (landform, vegetation, water bodies) rather than human origin (buildings, infrastructure).
	Natural landscapes are those characterised more by natural than built elements.
	The extent to which natural elements, patterns, and processes occur. The extent to which an area is unmodified.
er	An area's distinct combination of natural characteristics and qualities, including degree of naturalness.
itural ndscapes	Natural features and natural landscapes of outstanding value in a district or region in terms of their physical, associative, and/or perceptual attributes.
